UNESCO World Heritage Sites are special places in the world. They are cultural sites, for example, buildings and cities; or natural sites, for example, islands, mountains, or forests.

The cultural sites are important for human history and culture. They are old or unique places. Examples of famous cultural sites are the Roman town of Pompeii in Italy, the Pyramids in Egypt, and the Great Wall in China. Natural heritage sites are important places for animals and plants, or they are very beautiful places. Examples of natural sites are the Great Barrier Reef in Australia, Serengeti National Park in Tanzania, and the Galapagos Islands in the Pacific Ocean near Ecuador.
